Accelerated Renewable Energy Deployment on Islands with Emphasis on the Pacific Islands 26-28 October 2011

Background

Accelerating renewable energy deployment can enhance energy access and mitigate global warming in Small Island Developing States (SIDS). Pacific island countries face major challenges in energy security, energy access, and CO₂ mitigation. Fossil fuel prices are high, supply routes difficult, energy markets relatively small resulting in high cost and limited interest of suppliers. Some rural areas still witness low energy access.

Large potential in renewable energy resources such as solar, wind, and ocean have driven some islands to engage actively in renewable energy deployment as a viable solution to the specific conditions in the energy sector. Despite some efforts, the prospects to meet growing energy demand and generate changes in the energy mix are limited. A number of challenges remain such as estimating resource potential data, selecting suitable technology solutions, introducing enabling policy, setting up an appropriate institutional framework and building capacity.

IRENA has a strong mandate to take the lead at the global, regional, and national level for accelerating renewable energy uptake as a solution to national and regional energy strategies. One of its missions is to support and assist countries promoting renewable energy by providing them the means for an accelerated renewable energy technology uptake tailored to their specific needs, considering national conditions in resources endowment as well as social and economic factors. IRENA can also support the implementation of existing initiatives by playing a coordinating role to ensure an integrated approach at the regional level and providing a platform for harmonized implementation strategies of the renewable energy technologies in the region. IRENA is engaged in the development and execution of the Tonga Energy Road Map (TERM) and will continue to assist in the area of technology assessments.

Objective

The goal of the workshop is to discuss and identify the specific needs and challenges in deploying renewable energy technology on the Pacific islands, assessing the technology needs and gaps. Key players in the field will be invited from around the world to present state of the art knowledge on renewable energy technology deployment on islands, with focus on the Pacific islands. Possible areas of contribution where IRENA can support and assist in the region will also be discussed. The outcome of the workshop will provide inputs for the upcoming IRENA Renewable Energy Readiness Assessment and policy advisory and capacity building strategies in the region.

Output: Workshop conclusions including the main discussion points regarding the needs and gaps of the current energy situation, the role of IRENA, practical recommendations, and next steps.
