## Presentation of the Report of The Global Commission on the Geopolitics of the Energy Transformation

The ongoing global transition to sustainable energy sources does not just represent a shift from one energy source to another. It entails a much far-reaching transformation of the world's energy systems that will have major social, economic and political implications, as well as wide-ranging geopolitical consequences.

In response, IRENA established the Global Commission on the Geopolitics of the Energy Transformation with the support of the Governments of Germany, Norway and the United Arab Emirates. Composed of prominent leaders from different geographical and professional backgrounds in the fields of energy, politics, international affairs, economics, trade and development, the Global Commission examined how the energy transformation will reshape power relations, promote new patters of trade and address root causes of geopolitical instability. Its recently launched report, *A New World: The Geopolitics of the Energy Transformation*, highlights how the shift to renewables will enable many countries to achieve greater energy independence and enhance their development and security.

The energy transformation driven by renewables will also bring new opportunities and benefits such as job creation, improved energy access, enhanced food and water security. By contributing to reducing carbon emissions and strengthening climate resilience, renewables can also help address the security risks induced by climate change. At the same time, the energy transformation could result in risks related to stranded assets, cybersecurity and new dependencies on rare minerals. Overall, the benefits of the energy transformation will outweigh the challenges, but only if the right policies and strategies are in place. The Report concludes by underlining the vital need for countries to prepare for the new energy age and its geopolitical consequences.

#### **Objective**

The meeting aims to raise awareness and deepen understanding of the implications of this topical subject and its importance for global efforts to tackle climate change and advance sustainable development.

At the interactive high-level event, Adnan Z. Amin, Director-General of IRENA and member of the Commission, will discuss the findings of the *New World: The Geopolitics of the Energy Transformation*. It will also provide an opportunity for participants to exchange views on the key issues presented.
