

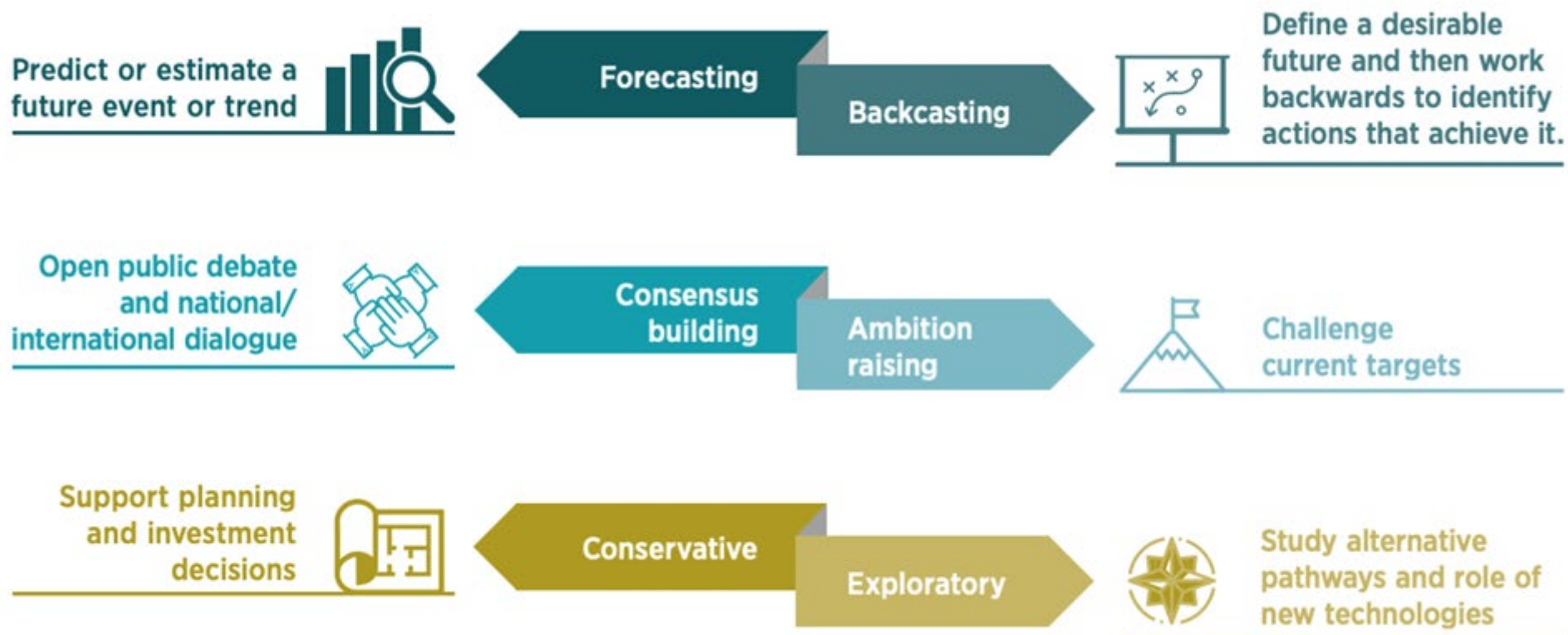

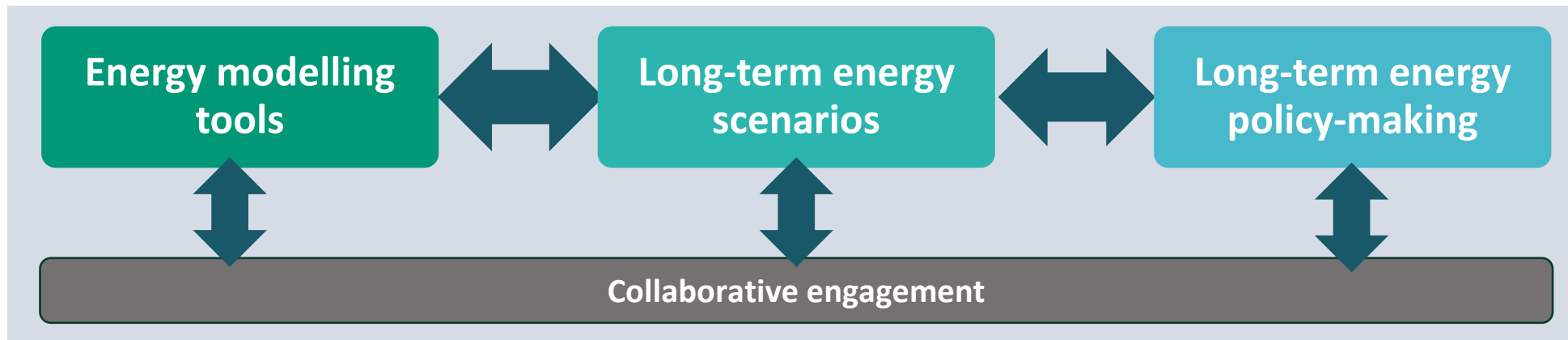

Purpose of developing LTES



Participatory processes can be a set of activities designed to cooperatively define, design, and influence energy plans and their implementation.

- Identifying blind spots

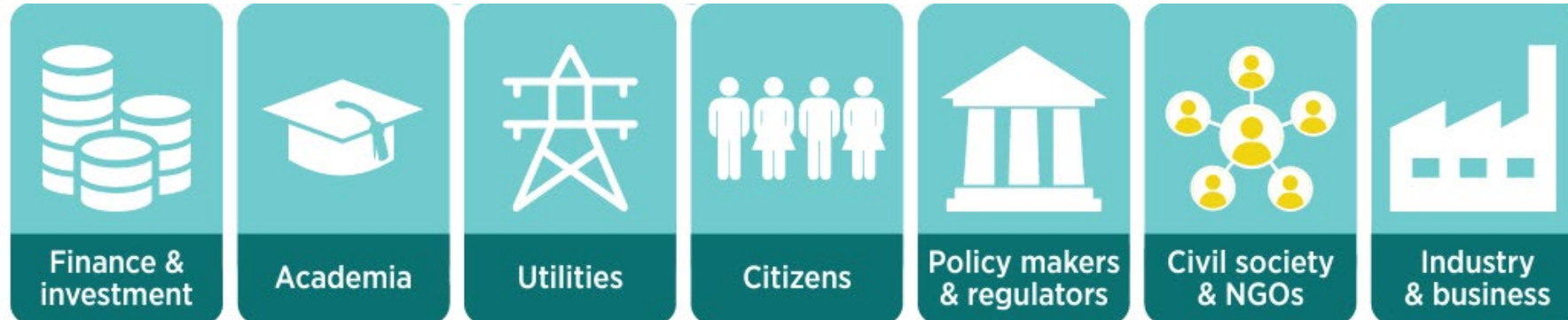
Communicating scenarios to stakeholders



Commonalities exist when communicating to different stakeholders:

- Bridging technical knowledge gap
- Clarifying scenario limitations
- Navigating biases
- Emphasizing stakeholder-specific concerns

Communicating scenarios to stakeholders



Communication can be done through participatory activities (i.e. workshops, surveys) and also through different media (data visualisation, presentations, reports, games, calculators, etc.)
