

IRENA events at COP24

3-14 December 2018 • Katowice, Poland

The global energy landscape is witnessing a rapid and wide-ranging change driven by an unprecedented growth of renewables. Record 167 gigawatts of new capacity were installed in 2017, the biggest growth ever and an 8.8% increase compared to the previous year. This energy transformation is happening due to falling costs and advances in technology and is underpinned by enabling policies. While the momentum is accelerating, the recent IPCC report unequivocally calls for an urgent large-scale energy transition fuelled by renewable energy. This mirrors IRENA's findings whereby renewables and energy efficiency combined can deliver up to 90% of energy-related emission reduction needs by 2050. Requested by its Members and supporting the Polish Presidency, IRENA's presence at COP24 will showcase the Agency's enabling role for prioritising renewables at the highest global agenda and harnessing countries renewable energy potential.

The event will highlight experiences and approaches adopted by LDCs and SIDS with the setting of a low emission development strategy target, action planning in renewable energy and other sectors, and project financing. The United Nations Office of the High Representative for the Least Developed Countries and Landlocked Developing Countries and Small Island Developing States (UN-OHRLLS) will also contribute to the discussion.
